CCA Update

Group purchasing for green energy. Joule/Hudson Valley Community Power are working on a new CCA contract. Can't replace Central Hudson, but they are looking for a new renewable energy provider. According to Jeff Domanski, they hope to include wind energy in the mix; plus there are more solar farms coming online. Joule provides vetting. One problem is that electric rates have been erratic. Columbia, the previous renewable energy supplier, has gotten out of the contract and is not welcomed by NY regulator. It looks promising for a new CCA after the winter. New model would be an index rate. HVCP will host an event in the future. Joule wants an opt out model. Potentially quarterly adjustments to the rate. This should give energy providers enough certainty that they can adjust to changing market conditions so that they will participate in the RFP, while still giving customers some protection from price spikes and overall lower prices due to competitive bidding.

Status of opt out community solar in the state: Still up in the air. Program could be up and running in April, 2023. RFP for new CCA is going out in February.
