RESOLUTION #55-2017: PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF AN ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION AT THE RONDOUT MUNICIPAL CENTER

WHEREAS, the Town of Rosendale has proposed to purchase and install an electric vehicle charging station at the Rondout Municipal Center, with the costs of the station to be shared between the Town of Rosendale and the Town of Marbletown; and

WHEREAS, the Towns of Marbletown and Rosendale are both Climate Smart Communities, and seek to support the shift to clean vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the two Towns have the opportunity to purchase a dual port, networked charging station from EV Connect at a substantially reduced price through a NYSERDA-funded rebate; and

WHEREAS, the cost of the charging station, accessories, and four-year network and management services package will be \$808.60 in total, or \$404.30 for each Town; and

WHEREAS, IBEW Local 363 will donate the electrical work to prepare the site, with the result that the costs of installation are expected to be minimal; and

WHEREAS, the charging station will be installed in the parking lot adjacent to the Marbletown wing of the building;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown authorizes the sharing of all costs with the Town of Rosendale associated with the purchase, installation, and operation of an electric vehicle charging station at the Rondout Municipal Center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall become effective upon approvals by both the Town Board of the Town of Rosendale and the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown.

LIAISON REPORTS

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YOUTH & RECREATION (Councilman Borzumato)

- RVGA will be having their Hoe Down at the park this Saturday.
- Soccer is in full swing with practices in the evenings during the week and games on Sunday's (300 children).
- The Community Center is busy during the week with classes/meetings.
- We hope to work on the beautification of the grounds in the next couple of weeks.
- The gymnastics and ninja warrior classes are fully booked with waiting lists. We have a staff of 5 -6 instructors. Classes run 2 afternoons a week with 70 children enrolled.
- Registration is ongoing for our winter wrestling program that starts at the end of November, this runs 3 nights a week at the RV High School.

JUSTICE (Councilman Borzumato)

• Justice Court report was read for the record.

HISTORIC COMM. (Councilman Adams)

- The High Falls Conservancy group made a presentation to the Historic Preservation Committe about landmarking the building down by the falls, which is owned by Central Hudson and built in the 1820's. Scenic Hudson might be interested in taking over this property.
- There are about 25-30 historic markers around town that are in various states of decay. Would it be possible to get these cleaned? Councilman Adams spoke to an artist and would like to find out how much this would cost.

PLANNING BOARD (Councilwoman Clarke)

• Monthly report from the Planning Board was provided to Town Clerk Moody for the records.

BUILDING (Councilman Sweeney)

• Monthly report from the Building department was provided to Town Clerk Moody for the records.

ASSESSOR'S OFFICE (Councilman Sweeney)

• Assessor Dunham has generated appraisal reports for all vacant land parcels and updated values for vacant land parcels. He will be doing field reviews of vacant land parcels as he does inspections of residential properties. They are also reviewing residential sales and developing appraisal models to be used to generate the appraisal reports to be used to value residential properties.

TOWN BUSINESS (Supervisor Warren)

- Thank you to Croswell's for providing the mulch for our pollinator gardens. Eric Stewart has done a great job with building and maintaining the gardens.
- There was a meeting last week with the County Film Commission. Discussion of what permits will be needed, should we charge for using town property? It was also noted that the County Film Commission mentioned that when the film companies come into town they are often looking for local contractors and local laborers.
- Charter/Spectrum contract is up next year. A handout was provided by Supervisor Warren.
- Supervisor Warren discussed attending a Department of Transportation meeting. The topic of having a cross walk put in in High Falls, across Rt. 213 was discussed.
- Councilman Borzumato inquired about the TE-9 forms that the County requested be sent in reference to the request for a reduced speed limit on Lucas Ave. Supervisor Warren said a letter was sent to the County Executive office, and he will keep the Town Board updated.
- Supervisor Warren announced that on Thursday 9/21/17 at 6:00pm there will be a joint town board meeting with the Town of Rosendale, the High Falls Water Commissioners and Ulster County Community College to discuss the proposed water line to the college. The meeting will be at the RMC in M-1.

<u>Motion to adjourn</u>: There being no further discussion Councilwoman Clarke, made the motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Councilman Sweeney; 5-0 Aye, motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:55PM.
