DISCIPLINARY POLICY

Each camper has a reasonable expectation to enjoy a positive camp experience. Therefore, the misbehavior of one camper, or a group of campers, should not be permitted to impact negatively on the camp experience of others. Most camps are short in duration, so prompt action is required when problems occur. Parents and campers should be aware of the disciplinary policy. Campers are encouraged to practice those social skills that will allow them to resolve conflicts and meet their needs without the use of harmful or destructive behaviors. When disciplinary situations occur that requires intervention, an adult provides the child with clear explanations as to why specific behavior is inappropriate. They then help him/her find alternative behavior that fits within the camp guidelines of appropriate behavior. These guidelines revolve around concerns for the safety of all members in camp.

Behavior Problems: If the camp staff encounter behavior problems with any participant, he/she will first attempt to resolve the problem with the camper, if this fails, the Camp Coordinator will be consulted, followed by the parents. There is a strict 4-Point Discipline Policy. If a camper gets 3 Written Warnings during the summer, he/she will be dismissed from the program. Every parent/guardian is required to read the following information to his/her camper and sign and return the 4- Point Discipline Policy Form to camp. This must be brought to camp on the first day of attendance.

General Summer Camp Program Rules

- Show respect to all campers, staff, park patrons, equipment and property.
- Keep your hands, feet, head and other body parts to yourself. Fighting, hitting, theft, destruction of property, etc. will not be tolerated.
- Appropriate language and dress at all times.
- Cooperation and participation involvement both in group activities and with other campers.

4-Point Policy

1. Verbal Warning
2. 1st Written Warning, Time Out/Activity Privilege Withheld (Parent/Guardian will be notified at time of pick-up)
3. 2nd Written Warning (Parent/Guardian will be contacted to pick up the camper immediately and he/she is removed from camp for the remainder of the day.
4. 3rd Written Warning (Parent/Guardian will be contacted to pick up the camper immediately and the child will be removed from the camp program and will not be eligible to return during the same season. No refunds will be given.

Immediate Dismissal:

1. Any child who runs away from the staff will be removed from the program for the remainder of the program. If staff cannot convince the child to return, the police will be called.
2. Any child who harms himself or another will be removed (physical and/or verbal abuse).
3. Physical violence is not tolerated in any program and the Town of Marbletown reserves the right to dismiss a participant whose behavior endangers the safety of themselves or others.
