RESOLUTION# 2022, CLASSIFYING ACTION AND ESTABLISHING LEAD AGENCY TYPE I ACTION FOR LOCAL LAW NO. 4 (PROPOSED) OF 2022, LOCAL LAW NO. 5 (PROPOSED) OF 2022 AND LOCAL LAW NO. 6 (PROPOSED) OF 2022

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown is considering establishment of a Community Preservation Fund by local law pursuant to Section 6-s of the General Municipal Law, the adoption of a Community Preservation Project Plan by local law, and the adoption of a local law to impose a real estate transfer tax on conveyances within the Town pursuant to Tax Law Article 33- B in the Town of Marbletown, Ulster County, New York; and

WHEREAS, Part I of a Full Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) dated June 21, 2022 has been prepared to address potential environmental impacts of the action; and **WHEREAS**, the Board has reviewed the thresholds for Type I and Type II actions set forth in 6 NYCRR 617.4 and 617.5; and

WHEREAS, after examining the EAF the Town Board has determined that there are no other involved and/or federal agencies on this matter since no other agency has approval authority with respect to the proposed action;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown (by the favorable vote of not less than a majority of all the members of the Board) as follows: 1. The Town Board of the Town of Marbletown hereby determines that the proposed action is a Type I action. 2. The Town Board of the Town of Marbletown hereby declares itself Lead Agency for the review of this action, as it is the only involved agency. 3. That a Determination of Significance will be made at such time as all reasonably necessary information has been received

by the Town Board to enable it to determine whether the action will or will not have a significant effect on the environment.
