RESOLUTION#81-2021 STRETCH ENERGY CODE

The following Resolution was offered by Councilwoman Foote, seconded by Councilman Hunt:

WHEREAS, to prevent a statewide patchwork of stricter energy codes, the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) developed the NYStretch Energy Code – 2020 (NYStretch);

WHEREAS, a stretch energy code is simply an energy code that is more stringent than the minimum base energy code that can be voluntarily adopted by local jurisdictions. NYStretch is a voluntary supplement to the 2020 Energy Conservation Construction Code of New York State (2020 ECCCNYS) improves its efficiency an average of ten to twelve percent (10-12 %) more efficient than the minimum requirements of the base energy code, the 2020 Energy Conservation Construction Code of New York State (2020 ECCCNYS);

WHEREAS, some New York State municipalities have adopted stricter energy standards to ensure reduced energy costs for its residents and businesses;

WHEREAS, under NY Energy Law § 11-109, the Town of Marbletown is authorized to adopt a local energy code more stringent that the 2020 ECCCNYS;

WHEREAS, the Town Board is considering amending provisions of the Town Code Chapter #99 to add provisions for a local energy code "NYStrech"; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 21, 2021, at which time all persons either for or against said amendments were heard; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board is declared Lead Agency for the purposes of environmental review with respect to the proposed resolution, in accordance with Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York, and the regulations promulgated thereunder at 6 NYCRR 617 (collectively, "SEQRA"); and WHEREAS, the Marbletown Town Board, as Lead Agency, has advised that the proposed action meets the criteria of a "Type II Action" under SEQRA; now, therefore, be it further

RESOLVED, that Local Law No. 5 of 2021 is hereby adopted as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. 5 OF 2021

A LOCAL LAW amending provisions of the Town Code Chapter #99 to add provisions for a local energy code "NYStrech" of the Marbletown Code;

- Tom Konrad, ECC Chairman, announced that there would be two public events coming up:

- Councilman Hunt stated that the Youth and Rec department has been very busy:
 - o Soccer season started and the fields are booked every evening,
 - o Gathering pricing for renovation of existing basketball court, pricing on new playground equipment and quotes on roof/repair replacement on pavilion,

- o Indoor Pickleball is back at the RMC gym and the outdoor Pickleball courts are scheduled to be installed next month at the RMC,
- o A virtual running program will be starting on October 1st. More information will be provided the town website and town social media and
- o Trunk or Treat will be held at the park on Sunday October 31st.
- Councilman Stewart brought up the subject of possibly adding additional staff for grounds crew at the park.
- Supervisor Parete stated that the budget will be submitted to Town Clerk Moody by 9/30 to be presented at the 10/5, in person, town board meeting.
- Councilman Hunt asked what was happening about expanding the water district. Supervisor Parete stated all of the surveys had sent to Brinnier and Larios and once they had reviewed them there would be a presentation for the town board with their recommendations. Councilman Hunt would like to see a timeline of what the process would be.
- Councilman LaFera stated that the Charlie Hass road dedication was well attended and thanked the board for their help in making the dedication happen.
- Councilman Stewart added he had attended the Sue Paterson Way dedication and that was a very nice event attended by quite a few people.
