PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED TRANSFER OF \$1,250.00

RESOLUTION #52-2023; PAY ENGINNERING SERVICES FOR NEW HIGHWAY GARAGE

The following Resolution was offered by Councilman LaFera and seconded by Councilman Davenport **WHEREAS**, the Town of Marbletown established a New Highway Garage Reserve Fund pursuant to Section 6-c of the General Municipal Law to provide funding for the purpose of, and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly advertised in the Daily Freeman, the official newspaper of said Town, on May 10, 2023, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on Tuesday May 16, 2023, where the proposal was explained and the town board heard comments from the residents, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown is in the process of planning for a new highway garage, and **WHEREAS**, the town has spent \$1,250 for engineering services, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Marbletown Town Board shall transfer \$1,250 from the New Highway Garage Reserve Fund for the above referenced work to 1440.4. This resolution is subject to permissive referendum pursuant to subdivision 4 of Section 6-c of the General Municipal Law.

RESOLUTION#53-2023; AUTHORIZING THE INSTALLATION OF TWO NEW STOP SIGNS AT INTERSECTION OF BERME AND CANAL ROADS

WHEREAS, the Town Highway Superintendent has indicated a need for two additional stop signs to be added at Berme and Canal Roads intersection creating a 3-way Stop intersection, and

WHEREAS, the safety of those traveling on these roads will be enhanced by making this 3-way Stop intersection, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown concurs with the Highway Superintendent recommendation that a 3-way Stop intersection at Berme and Canal Roads and to install the appropriate signage.

RESOLUTION #54-2023; MUNICITY INTEGRATED PARCEL MANAGEMENT UPGRADE

The following Resolution was offered by Councilman Davenport and seconded by Councilman LaFera

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown currently contracts with Municity to provide software for our Assessor, Building, Planning and Zoning Departments, and

WHEREAS, the Town would like to make available to the public via the internet information relating to the parcels, permits, inspections, complaints, variances, planning projects and more, and

WHEREAS, Municity 5 upgrade will help the Town of Marbletown become more efficient, secure, and better communicate with residents, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown authorizes the Supervisor to sign attached agreement with ICC Community Development Solutions, LLC for a cost not to exceed \$11,400.

- Supervisor Parete reported that this will be for the Building department and the Assessor's office will also use the program. There will be a \$2,500 license fee yearly. Residents will be able to search for information on their homes, public records, apply for permits and upload plans. Short Term Rentals might be able to register online.
- Councilman Davenport asked about training and Parete responded that it will be phased in over a couple of months and most of the training would be done online.

RESOLUTION #55-2023; AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF THE NYSERDA CLEAN ENERGY COMMUNITIES PROGRAM GRANT FOR THE BUILDING DEPARTMENT

The following Resolution was offered by Councilman LaFera and seconded by Councilman Davenport WHEREAS, the Town Supervisor requests authorization to accept a \$30,000 NYSERDA Clean Energy Communities Program Grant to pay for a 2023 Chevy Bolt EV to be used for the Building Department, and WHEREAS, said program provides funding to Clean Energy Communities to implement clean energy actions, save energy costs, improve the environment, and will be used for Inspections by the Building Department, and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Marbletown Town Board authorizes and approves acceptance of \$30,000 from NYSERDA, 17 Columbia Circle, Albany, New York 12203, and be it FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is authorized to execute any such agreements, documents or papers to purchase the 2023 Chevy Bolt EV and landscape equipment to be used by Parks and Recreation and the Highway Department.

• Supervisor Parete said that the car was approximately \$27,000 and with the remaining funds the town would purchase a new leaf blower.

OTHER BUSINESS:

- Supervisor Parete let everyone know that letters were sent out to residents that were eligible to pick a new CCA program and they can opt in to pick who they want to get their electricity from. You are able to opt in or out at any time.
- Supervisor Parete stated he would be having a meeting with a credit card company to discuss getting credit card machines in the office. Hopefully we would be able to start accepting credit cards sometime in June. Parete will send out the information to the Board.
- Councilman LaFera reported that they had a contractor come out and look at the roof at the community center and it is in worse shape then they first thought. In some places there are no shingles, and the rubber has torn away which has caused leaking. The town did have to have some emergency repairs done and they will look into getting bids for the whole roof.
- Supervisor Parete said the Memorial Day Parade would take place on Monday, May 29th, line up is at 9:30am and the parade will start at 10:00am. This year the parade route will go from the town plaza and end at the college where the ceremony will take place.

• Supervisor Parete said there would be a public hearing at some point about the Town purchasing the Osterhoudt property. Councilman Davenport pointed out that the town really needs to look into this and not rush it. Councilman LaFera said this would be a new process for the Town but not new for OSI. Parete reminded the board that he and Councilwoman Foote have been meeting since January about the possible purchasing of the Osterhoudt property. Once there is a proposed agreement a public hearing would be held.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

- Vivi Hlavsa, resident, asked about the CCA letter that went out to the eligible residents. Is everyone eligible? Supervisor Parete responded only the residents that are eligible received the letters.
- Nathan Plank, questioned whose decision it was to purchase the property? Supervisor Parete responded that the Community Preservation Fund Advisory Board evaluates potential projects based on the Community Preservation Plan and makes recommendations for the use of the Preservation Fund to the Town Board.

<u>Motion to adjourn:</u> There being no further discussion Councilman LaFera made the motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Councilman Davenport 3-0 Aye, 2 absent; motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 6:49pm.
