## RESOLUTION #67-2023; SUBMIT A CONSOLIDATED FUND APPLICATION (CFA) FOR ENGINEERING & DESIGN OF A SHARED SERVICES HIGHWAY GARAGE WITH THE TOWN OF ROSENDALE

The following Resolution was offered by Councilman Hunt and seconded by Councilwoman Foote

WHEREAS, the Towns of Rosendale & Marbletown have the need for new Highway Garages; and

**WHEREAS** the Towns believe they can create one facility to house the needs of both Highway Departments; and

WHEREAS a shared Highway Garage is believed to save in the cost of construction and operation; and

WHEREAS, New York State offers a Local Government Efficiency Program Grant; and

**WHEREAS**, each Town has the ability to qualify for \$200,000.00 towards engineering design and implementation.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown authorizes the Supervisor to apply for the Local Government Efficiency Program Grant for the shared highway garage.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this resolution shall become effective upon its passage by both the Town Board of the Town of Rosendale and the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown.

- Supervisor Parete stated the grant is due July 28<sup>th</sup> and the decision by the state will be announced in December. Parete added that Rosendale and Marbletown could receive up to \$400,000, jointly, \$200,000 each. The money would go to design, architectural work, surveys, stormwater plans, utilities and some infrastructure for the project.
- Councilman LaFera added even if the state was not offering the grant it would be beneficial to consolidate for cost savings.

# RESOLUTION #68-2023, SUPPORTING APPLICATION TO NEW YORK STATE OFFICE OF PARKS, RECREATION AND HISTORIC PRESERVATION'S ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION FUND FOR STATE ASSISTANCE IN FUNDING THE PURCHASE OF OSTERHOUDT FLATS PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown is requesting financial aid from the State of New York to assist

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown is requesting financial aid from the State of New York to assist in funding for the purchase of the Osterhoudt Flats property, Section Block and Lot #61.20-3-9.400; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Marbletown is applying to New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation for funding through the Environmental Protection Fund, Parks Program; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown is applying for this funding source through the 2023 New York State Consolidated Funding Application Round; and

WHEREAS, the grant application requires that the applicant obtain the approval and endorsement of the governing body of the municipality in which the project will be located; and

WHEREAS, the proposed application supports and advances the goals of the adopted Marbletown Community Preservation Plan, and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown does hereby approve and endorse the application to the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation for funding through the Environmental Protection Fund, Parks Program activity for funding to help purchase Osterhoudt Flats, and be it further,

**RESOLVED,** that the Town Supervisor is hereby authorized and directed to sign said grant application and to sign such additional documents and to take such additional steps as may be necessary in an effort to secure said funding.

### RESOLUTION#69-2023; LEASE RENEWAL WITH RVGA, INC. D/B/A RONDOUT VALLEY GROWERS ASSOCIATION

# RESOLUTION #70-2023: CONTRACT WITH WORLD MANAGEMENT RESOURCES TO DISPOSE OF AQUEOUS FILM-FORMING FOAM (AFFF) FROM THE FORMER MARBLETOWN FIRE HOUSE

WHEREAS, the Marbletown Fire District dissolved on December 31, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown now owns the property and would like to list for sale, and

**WHEREAS**, the firehouse contains five, five-gallon buckets of Aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) that the town needs to remove, and

WHEREAS, World Management Resource PO Box 276 North Salem, NY 10560 will pack, transport, and dispose of all buckets of AFFF, and

**RESOLVED,** the Town Board of Marbletown authorizes the Supervisor to sign the attached agreement with World Management Resource for \$3,239.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

- Councilman Davenport brought up the subject of leash mandates on the rail trail and asked the Board and audience members to remind people that dogs are to be leashed on the Rail Trail. Councilman LaFera pointed out that the town has a leash law. Parete questioned how we could enforce this going forward. Maybe we hire someone to walk the trails to enforce.
- Supervisor Parete distributed an assessment letter from Peak Engineering pertaining to a visual building assessment of the Marbletown Fire House. The conclusion of the assessment finds the Marbletown Fire House to be structurally sound and stable.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

- Charles Merguerian, resident, brought up the subject of providing some signage at the parking areas on the rail trail regarding leashing dogs on the trail.
- Stuart Leigh, resident, asked about bathing beach quality. Is there current interest in a bathing beach in Marbletown? Leigh added he called Jill McLean to discuss further. Leigh asked if it was because of geese feces or is it also septic that makes the bacteria levels too high? Mr. Leigh provided pictures and documents to the board pertaining to a survey and an application for water quality projects.
- Naomi Claudio, resident, who is speaking on behalf of Vivi Hvlasa and that Hvlasa is against removing the monuments from the Community Center.
- Laura Cunningham, resident, read and submitted a public comment, which is on file in the Town Clerk's office. Cunningham does not want the memorials removed from the Community Center and moved to the Stone Ridge Fire House.
- Claudine Brenner, resident, does not want the monuments moved to the Stone Ridge Fire House.
- Nina Shengold, resident, does not want the monument moved. River trail.
- At the end of the meeting a petition titled "Do Not Move Veteran's Monuments from Community Center" was handed to Deputy Clerk Cain.

<u>Motion to adjourn:</u> There being no further discussion Councilman LaFera made the motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Councilman Davenport 5-0 Aye, motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:10pm.
