Supervisor Parete pointed out that general taxes will go up 1.67% and the Highway will go up 3.77%. The ambulance district is going up 41.84%, adding that the past two years the town has taken money out of the reserves to cover some of the cost. It will be approximately \$51.30 more this year in taxes, for a property of \$400,000.

OTHER BUSINESS:

General

- Councilman Hunt stated that the Community Preservation Committee met this month and discussed the purchase of the Osterhoudt property.
- Councilman Hunt mentioned that the Youth and Recreation Department has been very busy, and they hope to use the probation program for help on the rail trail.
- Supervisor Parete announced that they have found a company to install the new water meters in High Falls. They hope to start the installations later in November. Attorney Mary Lou Christiana is reviewing the contract right now. Letters will go out to the residents and appointments will be set up for the company to go into the homes to install the meters.
- Councilman Hunt said that three 'Notification of Adult-Use Dispensary License Applications' were received from local people. Hunt reminded the board that the town has 30 days to comment, or we can ask for a 30-day extension. Attorney Kellogg added that we should ask for the 30-day extension. Supervisor Parete said they would work on a letter in the next couple of days. Councilman Davenport said he would like to discuss with Ted Fink around the zoning laws.
- Supervisor Parete stated that the town would be participating in the Trunk or Treat at the RMC on Oct. 27th and that trick or treaters will be welcome at the town offices on Halloween afternoon.
- Supervisor Parete mentioned the town was applying for a grant to hire a Recycling Coordinator at the Transfer Station. If the grant is awarded it would pay 50% of the salary of a recycling coordinator. This would help in bringing new programs to town. We could have our own Household Hazardous Day, composting program and more services the transfer station. Councilman Hunt brought up the subject of the free table at the transfer station. Councilman LaFera said we should be selective about what is on the tree table. Councilman Davenport asked about the liability of the town if someone gets hurt by a tool or an item they get at the free table.
- Supervisor Parete announced that the state is giving the towns the option to decide whether to include IRA distributions as part of the income for retired residents. Parete spoke with Jeremy Baraca, Assessor, and he recommends we don't allow that for exemptions. Parete said there would be further discussion.
- Supervisor Parete spoke with Scott Davis, town engineer, and he hopes to have his report on the Community Center ready in a couple of weeks.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

- Wendy Saul, resident, thanks Councilman LaFera for the help with the grant she is writing for roof work at the community center.
- Vivi Hlsava, resident, handed in a check to Town Clerk Moody which was a contribution towards the repair work at the Community Center.
- Bill Terpening, resident, had several questions about the budget. He asked specifically about certain lines on the budget, which were the salaries for the Supervisor, the Bookkeeper, the town accountant, the deputy town clerks, the Human Resources, the building department, grounds & maintenance, and youth and recreation. Supervisor Parete took the time and went over the salaries and what the lines on the budget represented.
- Christine Herbes Sommers, resident, asked about who makes the decision to hire certain contractors? Supervisor Parete responded that the town board is making the decision and there is a process.

<u>Motion to adjourn:</u> There being no further discussion Supervisor Parete made the motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Councilman Davenport 5-0 Aye, motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:25pm.
