MILL DAM ROAD BRIDGE

- Three bid packages were submitted to Town Clerk Moody on 10/2/2017. The bid packages were opened and read aloud at a meeting on 10/2/2017 at 1:00pm.
- Bids were submitted by:
 - o Advanced Enterprise Concrete and Excavation Inc. \$214,495.00
 - o Sun Up Enterprises, Inc. \$263,750.00
 - o Roehrs Construction \$388,800
- Highway Superintendent Dimler and Scott Davis, Peak Engineering reviewed all bids and recommended
 to the town board to go with the lowest bidder, Advanced Enterprise Concrete and Excavation Inc. After reviewing all packets, it was determined that each bid packet was missing a complete table of work.
 Peak Engineering reached out to all the bidders to request the missing information. Due to the missing
 information the resolution was amended, per below.

RESOLUTION #59-2017; THE TOWN BOARD DOES HEREBY ACCEPT THE LOWEST BIDDER FOR THE REPAIR/REPLACEMENT OF THE MILL DAM ROAD BRIDGE UNDER THESE CONDITIONS:

Town Board does hereby accept the lowest bidder for the repair/replacement of the Mill Dam, Road Bridge under these conditions:

The Town of Marbletown has received three bids. Advanced Enterprise Concrete and Excavation Inc., Sun Up Enterprises, Inc. and Roehrs Construction, Inc

WHEREAS, the Highway Department and Peak Engineering have determined that the Bridge on Mill Dam Road needs to be replaced; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown has publicly placed a legal advertisement for the work; and

WHEREAS, the lowest bidder is Advanced Enterprise Concrete and Excavation Inc. of Saugerties NY for the amount of \$214,495.00 and Sun UP Enterprises Inc was the second lowest bidder at \$263,750 and all bidders have not submitted all the required documents with the bid proposal; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown accepts the lowest bid for the Mill Dam Road Bridge and authorizes the Supervisor to sign the contract with either Advanced Enterprise Concrete and Excavation Inc or Sun Up Enterprises based on the bidder submitting the "Table of Work" detail and being the lowest qualified bidder not to exceed \$263,750.

- Once the Mill Dam Road bridge work begins it should take approximately eight weeks to complete and the bridge will be closed during that time, detours will be posted.
- The Highway Department will be doing a lot of the prep work themselves and will take care of the paving once the bridge is complete.

PHARMACEUTICAL COLLECTION

- Tom Konrad, ECC Chairman presented a draft letter asking Governor Cuomo to veto the pharmaceutical waste collection bill passed early this summer, S.6750-A.387B. Presently pharmacies have objected to being forced to participate in the disposal of unwanted drugs. At this time Governor Cuomo has not taken any action
- Councilman Adams read aloud from the law which offers three possibilities for disposal; receptacles in pharmacies, receptacles at police stations or a mail-in program.
- Councilwoman Clarke and Councilman Sweeney requested to have more time to review the senate and
 assembly bills before signing a letter to the Governor. It was decided to revisit this topic at the next town
 board meeting.

MID-HUDSON STREETLIGHT CONSORTIUM'S LED STREETLIGHT RFP

- Tom Konrad stated the need for an RFP for Mid-Hudson lighting in the matter of new LED streetlights for Stone Ridge. The Town of Marbletown has approximately fifty streetlights total. If the town participates we'll get more support. If we don't participate it will be less support for the town.
- It has been suggested the town sign on by early November 2017 to get the lights before summer 2018.
- Councilman Sweeney requested the information be sent out to the town board so they can review and
 discuss participating at the next meeting. Konrad will send out all the information via e-mail to the town
 board.

ENERGY BENCHMARKING-IMPLEMENTATION

• In February 2017 a resolution was passed to keep track of the town energy use. Konrad stated he will have the woman contact Town Clerk Moody to discuss how and when this needs to be done.

<u>Motion to adjourn:</u> There being no further discussion Councilwoman Clarke, made the motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Councilman Sweeney; 5-0 Aye, motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:55pm.
