<u>PUBLIC HEARING (CONTINUATION) LOCAL LAW #3-2019; A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND THE</u> MARBLETOWN SOLAR GENERATION SYSTEMS

- The public hearing on proposed Local Law #3-2019 was held open from the July 16th meeting.
- Supervisor Parete asked if there were any more comments on proposed Local Law #3-2019, amending the Marbletown solar generations systems.
- Response from the Ulster County Planning Board was reviewed and discussed. One thing they have requested is the SEQRA determination.
- Attorney Kellogg reviewed the SEQRA assessment forms and clarified definitions.
- A motion was made by Councilman LaFera, seconded by Councilman Borzumato to adopt the approved SEQRA assessment forms. 5-0 Aye, motion carried. (Resolution #54-2019).
- With no further discussion or comments Councilman Sweeney made a motion, seconded by Councilman LaFera to close the public hearing on proposed local law #3-2019.
- Town Clerk Moody will file the law with the State.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

<u>Tom Konrad:</u> Resident and ECC Chairman discussed a couple group buying options for a few clean energy technologies that are going on right now. Negotiations have been made for group purchases of home solar; air source heat pumps, building insulation and air sealing, and heat pump water heaters. <u>Kate Reese Hurd:</u> Resident who read a statement and handed out an article from the Journal of Chemical Neuroanatomy concerning the effects of microwave/EMF radiation and the five criteria of causality. <u>Susan Sprachman:</u> Resident who questioned the pollution in the Esopus Creek, testing of the water and the closing of the beach this year. Has a study been done to determine what is causing the pollution? *Councilman Stewart responded that he has been the one to take the samples and it has been determined by the test that it is most likely agricultural run-off and possibly sewer leaking into the creek.*

WHEREAS, one proposal was received on July 16, 2019 from Carl Bell Plumbing, Heating and HVAC of Kingston, NY in the amount of \$9,375.00; and

WHEREAS, the engineers, Brinnier and Larios, P.C. have recommended award of this contract to Carl Bell Plumbing, Heating and HVAC of Kingston, NY in the amount of \$9,375.00; and

WHEREAS, the piping work is a Type 2 Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617 (5)(c)(31); and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the High Falls Water District is authorized to execute a purchase order to Carl Bell Plumbing, Heating and HVAC of Kingston, NY in the amount of \$9,375.00 and the Supervisor is authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to affect such purchase. This resolution is contingent upon a like resolution being passed by the Town of Rosendale Town Board.
