RESOLUTION #103-2020; PAY CONSTRUCTION COSTS FOR TOWN OWNED BUILDINGS AND PARK

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown established a Buildings Replace/Repair Reserve Fund pursuant to Section 6-c of the General Municipal Law to provide funding for the purpose of financing Replace/Repairs and capital improvements to the seven buildings owned by the Town of Marbletown, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown upgraded buildings and parks, and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly advertised in the Daily Freeman, the official newspaper of said Town, on November 13, 2020, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on Tuesday November 17 at 6:00PM, where the proposal was explained and the town board heard comments from the residents, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Marbletown renovated old town hall to accommodate the Rondout Valley Food Pantry, and

WHEREAS, the town has spent \$90,768 for Maintenance and Repair Costs to town owned facilities,

- 1. **Transfer Station--**\$40,657 for retaining wall, shed, electric work and mulch trees and brush.
- **2. Rondout Municipal Center--**\$4085 to build a break room.
- **3. Community Center--**\$40,364 for new well pump, air-seal & insulation of attic, vapor barriers, and spray foam.
- 4. Marbletown Park--\$4135 repair concrete floor under pavilion
- **5. Highway Garage--**\$1,527 replace doors

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Marbletown Town Board shall transfer \$90,768 from the Buildings Replace/Repair Reserve Fund for the above referenced work to Buildings Old Town Hall Expense line 1620.4. This resolution is subject to permissive referendum pursuant to subdivision 4 of Section 6-c of the General Municipal Law

• Councilman LaFera pointed out that he would really like to see the fire district be on scene at the Mountain house for the fireworks.

OTHER TOWN BUSINESS:

- Supervisor Parete said the town offices will be closed on Thurdsay the 26th and Friday the 27th for Thanksgiving. The Highway department will be closed on Wednesday the 25th also. The Transfer Station will be open their regular days of Tuesday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday next week.
- Supervisor Parete said that a special town board meeting might by called once the resolution, to extend the RMC lease for 6 months, is ready to sign and it might have to get done by 11/30/2020.
- Councilwoman Foote reiterated that the town will be looking for volunteers to join the Marbletown Preservation and Investment Commission. They are hoping to find people from different areas, i.e. historian, ECC, finance, etc. This Commission will be tasked with identifying ways to protect and conserve working farmland and other natural areas in the town. Anyone interested should reach out to Councilwoman Foote or any other town board members. Councilwoman Foote mentioned she was going to check out what they did in Woodstock.
- Supervisor Parete said the Town received two bids for installing new water meters in High Falls. Unfortunately, one company they had done the water meters in Rosendale had the wrong date for the bid openings. This discussion is ongoing.
- Councilman Stewart stated that he and Supervisor Parete met with Craig Tripp to discuss the Grady Park project and paperwork has been filed with the DEC pertaining to wetlands. Supervisor Parete said they are now waiting on cost estimates.

- Supervisor Parete said he had met with the owner of the Rock Cliff Tavern and discussed possibly creating some parking for the town.
- Supervisor Parete mentioned that the Marbletown Historic Preservation Commission was up and running again and he thanked Bill Merchant, John Harrington, and Scott Davis for volunteering. He mentioned that they will all need to sign oaths of office and they should reach out to Town Clerk Moody.
